

# An Industrial Domino Effect in the Wyoming Range?

## Don't Let Them Fall

**3** If the 44,700 acres are leased, one the first areas to be industrialized will be the Beaver/Horse Creek area. Here, in the heart of prime hunting/recreating lands, an out-of-state wildcatter, Stanley Energy, has already announced plans to drill 200 wells on eight, fifty-acre well pads.



**1** Plains Exploration and Production company (PXP) has proposed 136 wells in the Hoback area. This could be a "Jonah Field in the Woods" and the first industrial domino to fall.

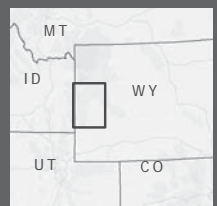


**2** The second domino could be the 44,700 contested acres along the eastern gateway back on track for gas leasing (see white blocks). These areas include popular recreation sites such as McDougal Gap. If allowed, industry will also gain access for drilling further into the interior.



Legislation to protect the Wyoming Range was recently introduced in Congress. If passed, it would permanently protect the area contained within the black boundary from future oil and gas leasing. It is important the areas in the boundary remain unleased so that legislation, when passed, can protect them.
